Peer Support Worker – Road to Recovery Home

The Road to Recovery home provides in-house peer support in a congregate living model. The program focuses on securing a safe environment for consumers whose recovery would benefit from community integration. The goal of the Road to Recovery home is to enhance choice by increasing options for supportive housing, thereby enabling health recovery, community integration and tenure, and an increase in quality of life.

Purpose of the Position: The Peer Support worker will work along-side a team to encourage and support consumers to learn and apply the life skills necessary to facilitate recovery, community integration and improve quality of life. The work schedule will include rotating shifts, weekends and statutory holidays.

- Experience in providing peer support to individuals with lived mental health and/or substance use issues
- Experience coordinating and facilitating social recreational activities is considered an asset.
- Must be able to work professionally, autonomously, collaboratively and respectfully within a team environment.

- Ability to demonstrate empathy and compassion of the ideas, beliefs and feelings of others.
- Effective written and verbal communication skills.
- Ability to demonstrate conflict resolution skills.

- Prepared to work autonomously and cooperatively within a team.
- Contributes to team morale
- Capacity to handle a heavy workload, including rotating weekend, evening and statutory holiday shifts.

- Minimum one (1) year personal experience in the mental health addiction system as a consumer/survivor or family member.

- Aboriginal Cultural awareness and aboriginal education is an asset.
- Bilingual in French/English language considered an asset
