Purpose of the Position: The Peer Support Worker with COI will encourage and support individuals living with mental health issues as clients/survivors and/or family members. The Peer Support Worker is responsible for providing opportunities for recreational, social and life skills-building within a safe and supportive environment for consumers who have experienced mental illness and/or substance use issues.

Skills and Experience:

- Experience in providing peer support to individuals with lived mental health and/or substance use issues
- Experience coordinating and facilitating social recreational activities is considered an asset.
- Must be able to work professionally, autonomously, collaboratively and respectfully within a team environment.
- Demonstrated team-building skills
- Capable of speaking in groups and presenting to an audience is considered an asset.
- Ability to demonstrate empathy and compassion of the ideas, beliefs and feelings of others.

- Prepared to work autonomously and cooperatively within a team.

- Aboriginal Cultural awareness and aboriginal education is an asset.
