Dr. Ed Connors is of Mohawk (from Kahnawake Mohawk Territory) and Irish ancestry. He is a psychologist who has worked with the First Nations communities across Canada since 1982 in both urban and rural centers. His work over this time has included Clinical Director for an Infant Mental Health Center in the city of Regina and Director for the sacred Circle, a Suicide Prevention-Program developed to serve First Nation Communities in Northwestern Ontario.

Dr. Connors' most recent work has involved development of Indigenous Life Promotion projects, including Feather Carriers Leadership for Life Promotion. While developing this service, Dr. Connors worked with Elders and apprenticed in traditional First Nations approaches to healing. Today his practice incorporated traditional knowledge about healing while also employing his training as a psychologist. His current works include consultation and community training to assist First Nations in the development of Restorative Justice programs.
